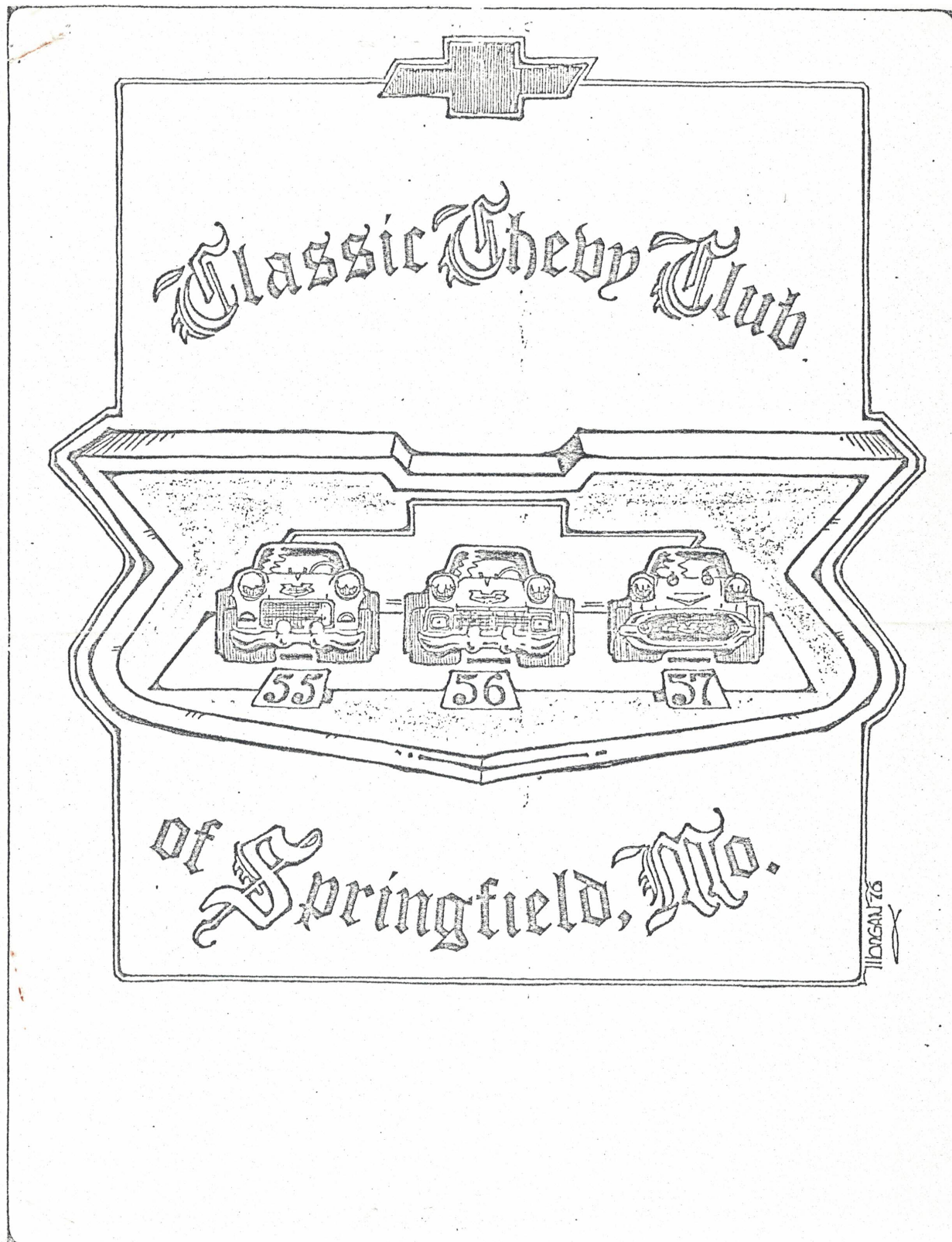

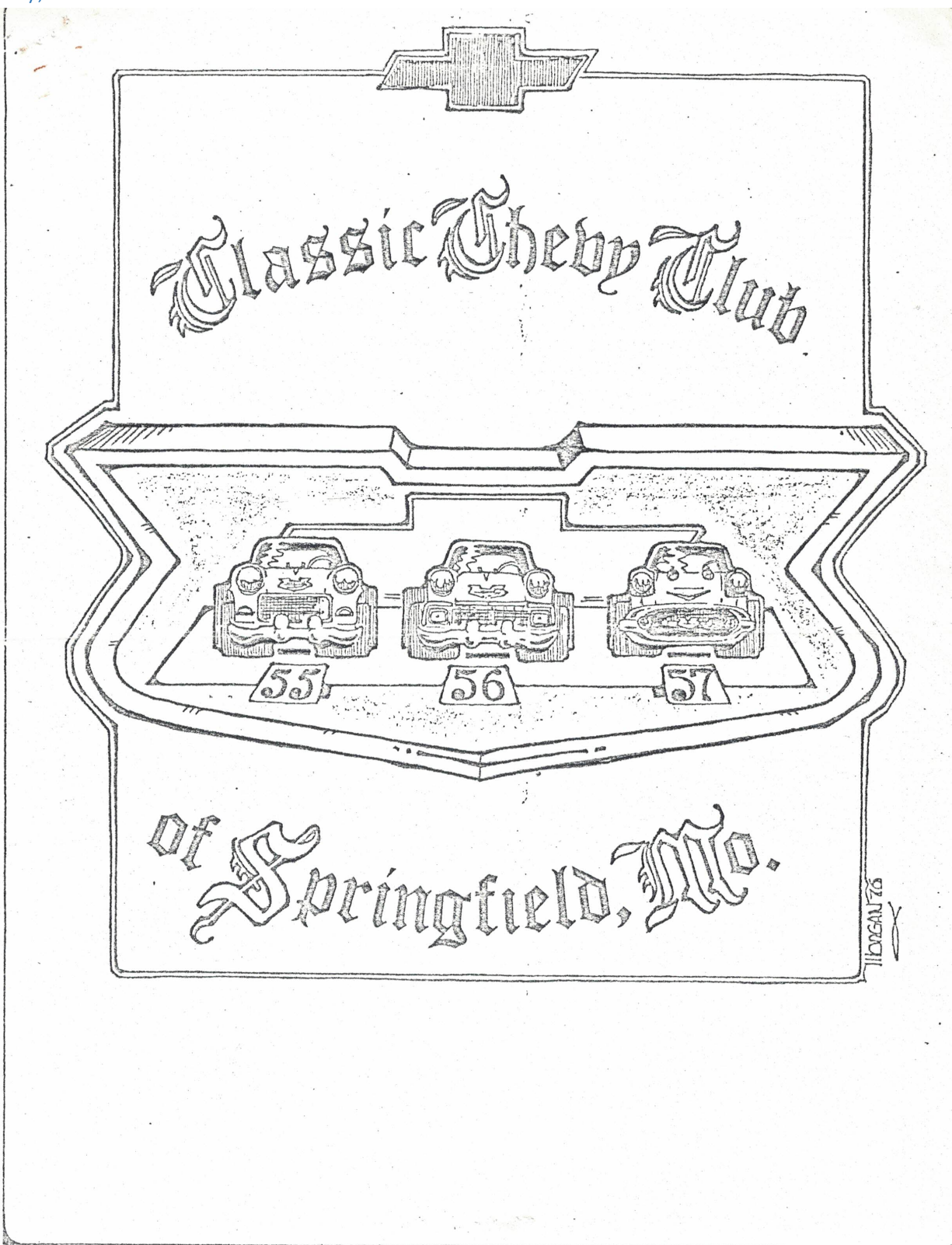
PINEAPPLE MARSHMALLOW DESERT - Shirley Close

CLASSIC COOKER

CHINESE STYLE HAMBURGER CASSEROLE - Ann Robertson

1 lb. ground beef
1 cup sliced celery
2 onions (chopped)
1 can mushroom soup
1 1/2 cup warm water
1/4 cup soy sauce
1/2 cup uncooked rice
1 cup Chinese Noodles (Chow Mein)
dash pepper

Brown meat. Drain off excess grease. Add onions, celery and soup. Mix in water. Stir in rice, soy sauce and pepper. Turn into large greased Casserole, then bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Cover top with (Chow Mein) noodles and bake 15 minutes longer.

CHERRY CHEESE CAKE - Myrtle St. John

Crust - 1/2 cup sugar

1 1/2 cup Graham Cracker crumbs

1/2 stick oleo (melted)

Use fork to mix well and press in bottom of large pyrex dish.

Filling - 8 oz. Philadelphia Cream Cheese

1/2 cup sugar

2 pkg. Dream Whip (the box that makes 2 cups)

Have cream cheese softened and add sugar. Mix Dream Whip according to direction and fold with cream cheese mixture. Put this on top of crumbs and chill or freeze until ready to use. Chill 1 can of Wilderness Cherry pie filling. Add 1/2 cup sugar to pie filling before putting on Cheese Cake.

CLASSIC COOKER

TEXAS SHEET CAKE - Dorcas Sears

2 cup sugar	1/2 cup milk
2 cup flour	1 tsp. baking soda
1 stick oleo	2 eggs
1 cup shortening	1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup water	4 tbsp. cocoa

Mix sugar and flour in large bowl. Put oleo, shortening, water, and cocoa in saucepan. Bring this to boil and pour over sugar and flour mixture. Beat eggs, add baking soda to milk. Combine eggs, milk and vanilla. Add to other mixture and blend in well.

Bake in greased pan at 400° for 20 minutes.

Frosting

1 stick oleo	1 tbsp. vanilla
4 tbsp. cocoa	1 box powdered sugar
6 tbsp. milk	1 cup chopped nuts if desired

Using same saucepan, melt oleo, add cocoa, milk, vanilla, and powdered sugar. Beat, spread on cake while hot and sprinkle with nuts.

SPECIAL "K" BARS - Dorcas Sears

1 cup white syrup
1 cup sugar

Mix and bring to a boil. Add 1 cup crunchy peanut butter. Pour over 5 cups of Special K cereal and spread in 9x13 greased pan.

Icing

1/2 stick melted butter	1/2 tsp. vanilla
2 tbsp. cocoa	1/2 box powdered sugar
3 tbsp. milk	

Melt oleo, add cocoa, milk, vanilla and powdered sugar and mix together. Ice bars then cut in squares.
