Highlights from 1930-1935...

Members with cars from these years are Jack and Donna Wernet – 1931 Ford Coupe, Jess and Melinda Owen – 1932 Ford 3 window coupe, Tom and Barb Trosper – 1933 Ford coupe, and Jake and Pam Loller – 1934 Ford 3 window coupe and Wayne and Rita Bruffey – 1933 Ford coupe.

1931 was the first year Ford surpassed Chevrolet in production by 1100. Chevy took the honor back in 1932 and the first of many swaps for this title had begun. 1932 saw the first V8 engine for Ford with the standard roadster, coupe and phaeton all listed below \$500. The V8 had a top speed of 78 mph. Due to a rush to market there were many problems with the engine the first year but were quickly corrected with the V8 becoming known as a reliable engine making it a hot rodders favorite.
